

QUICK SURVEY RESULTS Board Document Software

January 20, 2023

A total of 27 colleges/districts responded to ICCTA's Quick Survey on BOARD DOCUMENT SOFTWARE.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Nearly half (48%) of responding colleges use a combination of Microsoft and Adobe software to compile their board documents.
- One-third of respondents (9 colleges) use specialized software to prepare their board documents.
- BoardDocs is the most common specialized software used for board document management.

- Kishwaukee: BoardDocs is very user friendly and offers user support both online and via phone as well as 1:1 initial training and group training classes. Using BoardDocs has been a great way to archive your Board meeting agendas and supporting documentation in an organized electronic format. I love the BoardDocs search feature which allows you to easily navigate to any current or historical information within BoardDocs, which I have found to be especially helpful when looking up historical information. Meeting minutes are much easier to do as BoardDocs uses your meeting agenda as a template for your minutes and automatically pulls in your agenda information to your minutes which you can edit as needed.
- Lewis and Clark: We are fairly new to this program, and I love it. Board members resisted at first, but they have adapted. We also use this for tracking other groups, progress, documents, etc. but I am confident we are not using to full potential.
