Now that the state has mandated that the vice chair automatically ascends to the role of chair if the chair position is vacated, we have had to rethink that.

• Heartland Community College: Slate is created in an informal process, usually coordinated by a trustee who is not interested in being an office. This trustee asks the other trustees if they: 1) would re-nominate the same slate of officers; 2) would like to have at least one new trustee in an officer position; 2) would like to be an office (and for which position).
