A total of 20 colleges/districts responded to ICCTA's Quick Survey on STUDENT ID CARDS.

1. DOES YOUR INSTITUTION ISSUE A STUDENT ID CARD?

Yes -- 20 Danville DuPage

Elgin: We issue photo ID cards for all credit seeking students.

Harper

Highland: Only for students choosing to have a YMCA membership on campus.

2. IF SO, WHAT COMPANY (OR COMPANIES) PRODUCTS ARE FACILITATING THE PROCESS?

Danville: IDville

DuPage: We print them in-house.

Elgin: We work with Identisys for maintenance and supplies and have a Zebra printer.

Harper: DataCard SD460 printers and DataCard WebID software

Illinois Valley: We do them internally--Avigilon is the system.

Joliet: The companies that assist Joliet Junior College with facilitating our Student ID card process

are Identisys, Plastic Card, Cloudcard, Valid, Valcam, Campus Marketing Solutions, Rydin

Decal, Amazon and Office Max.

Kaskaskia: Elliott Data

Kishwaukee: Badge pass, Identisys

Lake County: IdentiSys

Lake Land: HID cards, Fargo ID printer, Identisy software

Logan: We are using an internal process.

Oakton: They are designed and printed on campus as requested.

Parkland: We currently use Identisys but will be moving to LenelS2.

Richland: Alpha Card for the software, we design the cards in-house.

Sandburg: We make ours in house, we purchase the cards, take students picture, and print here at

Sandburg within 5 minutes.

Sauk Valley: Internally issued using "ASUREID" software on one computer

South Suburban: None - internal process through Colleague

Spoon River: We print in house using Zebra hardware.

Waubonsee: Blackboard

3. DO YOU CHARGE A FEE FOR A STUDENT ID CARD?

Yes - 1

Joliet: The initial fee for the Joliet Junior College Student ID card is included in with the other student

fees associated with the enrollment process for our students. A replacement fee is also

charged if the Student ID is lost or stolen.

Danville: First one is free, \$5 for additional IDs

DuPage: Free for first ID, \$5 for additional

Elgin: All students get their first photo ID free of charge, however if a replacement ID is needed,

there is a \$5 fee. We also issue specialty cards for Health Services and EMT students, those are \$2.50 each. EMT department covers the cost for students, Health Services students are

required to cover that cost.

Harper: Not for the first card. Replacement cards are \$5 if not expired. Free replacement for expired ID

cards.

Illinois Valley: There is a \$5 fee to replace a lost, stolen, or damaged ID card. First one is free.

Lake County: Only for a replacement ID

Lake Land: First one is free; replacements are \$10 each.

Logan

Oakton: No, unless they lose it. Replacement fee is \$1.

Parkland: There is no initial cost. Replacement cards are \$5 for the first, \$10 for the second, and \$15

after that. Our software shows the number of prints when we pull up the card. If the card is

more than three years old, we replace it for free.

Richland: Only for a replacement \$5.00

Sauk Valley: Only for replacement cards within the academic year that it was issued

Spoon River No, but there is a \$15 fee for a replacement card.

4. DOES YOUR STUDENT ID CARD PROVIDE ACCESS TO SERVICES, BUILDINGS, ETC.?

Yes -- 10

DuPage: Library card, gym pass, useful for other student discounts

Elgin: Student photo IDs primarily serve as a form of identification. Students use them in the library

and bookstore to access services. No funding is associated with the cards.

Harper: Student ID Cards are used for: Library Card, Fitness Center Card, Printing in Computer Labs

Joliet: Our Student ID is not a door access card. It is, however, required identification in the

Counseling Office, Financial Aid Office, Testing Center, Tutoring Center, Fitness Center,

Relaxation Room, library, computer labs, and bookstore.

Kishwaukee: They provide access to library services and printing.

Oakton: Borrow books, DVDs, regular and technology reserves, etc. from either campus library

Student ID Learning Center to check-in for tutoring

Testing Center (in addition to a photo ID), Learning Center, and Fitness Center

Student ID to get discounts anywhere that offers 'student' prices with no age limit (movie

theaters, museums, Ravinia, etc.)

Parkland: Our old system used to provide limited access using magnetic swipe cards. We are in the

process of switching systems that will grant specific access to students in those classes or organizations. Ex: Dental Hygiene locker rooms, darkroom access for photography students,

music practice rooms, etc.

Richland: Fitness Center, Library Services, public transportation, clinical sites

Sandburg: It can be used as a library card, free admittance to athletic events, any transaction in student

services, admittance to fitness center, provide students with free city transportation, purchase

of books at bookstore, admittance to tutoring center.

Spoon River: It serves as the student's library card and allows them into sporting events on campus at no

charge. It is also used by various departments on campus to verify a student's identity before

confidential information is provided to the student.

5. ARE THERE BENEFITS THAT GO ALONG WITH A STUDENT HAVING AN ID CARD (SUCH AS LOCAL BUSINESS DISCOUNTS, ETC.)?

Yes - 14

Danville: Discounted city bus prices

DuPage: Movie theater tickets, Great America discounts

Elgin: Students receive discounts at local movie theatre, coffee shops, cell phone carriers, Best Buy,

and some local restaurants.

Harper: Students receive discounts for College sponsored event tickets on campus at the Box Office

as well as any discount tickets for area attractions the Box Office is selling at the time.

Illinois Valley: Sometimes at local restaurants. Generally for free access to events on campus

Joliet: The Joliet Junior College Student ID card provides discounts for our students at several

businesses at the owner's discretion.

Lake Land: Not specific to our college just general college student discounts at various business but not

connected to the college

Oakton

Parkland: Computer lab, library materials & equipment loans, student election voting, discount tickets to

Parkland Theatre & Staerkel Planetarium, entry to Fitness Center (with registration), and

Parkland Bookstore book rentals.

Richland: There are area businesses that will provide discounts if a student ID is presented

Sandburg: We get free city bus transportation.

Sauk Valley: We believe there are, but are unable to confirm how businesses utilize them.

Spoon River: Free entry into on campus sporting events and discounts at various businesses in our

communities.

6. WHAT PROPORTION OF YOUR STUDENT BODY OBTAINS AN ID CARD?

Danville: Approximately 40%

Elgin: Probably 80% of our students have a photo ID. We have been issuing student photo ID's

since 2008. All first-time in-college students receive one through new student orientation. If a student wants to check out a library book or movie or use financial aid money in the bookstore

they must present a student ID.

Harper: Since we are a commuter school without on campus housing, many students can successfully

complete their time here without obtaining a Student ID. It is also not required. I would imagine

we are around the 50% mark.

Illinois Valley: About 50%

Joliet: It is mandatory for all the students at Joliet Junior College to obtain an ID card.

Kaskaskia: 60%

Kishwaukee: Unknown

Lake County: Approximately 15%

Lake Land: 70-75% is my estimate; since it's not required we don't have a great way to track

Logan: 75%

Parkland: Every student is encouraged to get one.

Richland: About 45-55%

Sandburg: Everyone 100% Faculty and staff have ID's as well.

Sauk Valley: 80% of new students since we do not issue to all dual credit students.

South Suburban: Approximately 30%

Spoon River: Approximately 95%, not including dual credit students.

Waubonsee: Unknown

7. PLEASE SHARE ANY ADDITIONAL FEEDBACK REGARDING STUDENT ID CARDS:

• All student photo ID cards expire three years from issuance. If the student's card expires,

they can turn it in and get a new one at no cost.

• Photo ID's are handled through the Student Life Office

• Photo ID's are required for all employees as well.

• We will be moving to digital photo ID's over the next 18 months.

· We are a Colleague school and our photo ID's use Active Directory to pull preferred name

and student ID number from Colleague.

Illinois Valley We use same card for employee cards as well -- they have access.

Joliet Thank you for the opportunity to complete this survey.

Lake County We are considering moving to a digital ID card.

Logan We are hoping to move toward using a "one card solution" in the next three years that include

library, fitness center and possibly linked to Financial Aid distribution.

South Suburban We offer both physical and virtual ID cards.

Spoon River We create the majority of our student ID cards during New Student Orientation each fall.

During the first week of classes, a student ID event is held to catch those who may not have

attended Orientation.

Waubonsee Students are not required to have an ID card.
